TEACHING SPANISH TO **HERITAGE/BILINGUAL** LEARNERS CERTIFICATE

A graduate certificate in teaching Spanish to heritage/bilingual learners will provide students with the opportunity to earn a graduate certificate after completion of 18 credit hours. Courses will focus on the study of sociolinguistic and pedagogical (theory and practice) subjects relevant to the intricacies and challenges of teaching Spanish to bilingual learners (children who are bilingual) and heritage learners (bilingual adults).

Spring 2026, Summer, 2026, and Fall 2026: Applications for this program are accepted on a rolling basis with a priority deadline of June 30 for fall admission, November 15 for spring admission, and April 15 for summer admission

Other Requirements

- Undergraduate grade point average of at least 3.0
- English Language Proficiency: Applicants are required to have a command of oral and written English. Those who do not hold a baccalaureate or other advanced degree from the United States, OR a baccalaureate or other advanced degree from a predetermined country on the waiver list (https://www.unomaha.edu/office-of-graduatestudies/admissions/entrance-exams.php), must meet the minimum language proficiency score requirement in order to be considered for admission.
 - Internet-based TOEFL: 100, IELTS: 7.5, PTE: 68, Duolingo: 130
- Statement of Purpose: A personal statement (700-900 words, double space), written Spanish. Some topics you might want to consider:
 - Interests and qualifications for graduate study;
 - · Description of yourself and your intellectual development;
 - · Strengths and weaknesses, and how you overcame them or challenges to overcoming them;
 - Reasons why you want to join this program;
 - · Possible areas of research or deeper study;
 - · What you want to do after completion of the certificate.
- Applicants must have at least advanced-low proficiency in Spanish.
